The 2015 Annual MLEFIAA Firearms Instructor Development Conference will be held September 22 through 24, 2015. The entire conference, including the Law Enforcement Product Expo, will take place at the Harvard Sportsman's Club located five minutes off both I-495 and Route 2. HSC is the premier private shooting facility in Massachusetts featuring over a dozen ranges including a 300 yard rifle, combat pistol, law enforcement rifle & shotgun as well as full auto ranges.

The Executive Board has worked to keep the tuition rate at an affordable \$225 for MLEFIAA members and \$300 for non-members. Your tuition includes lunch on all three days. If a member wishes to include their annual dues, the tuition is \$255. Payment must be received in order for your slot to be reserved. There will be no walk in registrations permitted.

You may also print and complete the form at the back of this catalog and submit it to MLEFIAA Conference 2010, P.O. Box 253, Princeton, MA 01541-0253 with your payment. Please note that your seat at the conference is not confirmed until payment is received.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Title of Presentation: POINT SHOOTING WITH THE HANDGUN

Presenters: Sgt Ulf Petersson

Agency: Skåne PD (Sweden)

Brief overview of presentation: Point Shooting with handgun based on techniques pioneered by Fairbairn, Sykes and Applegate. The course will begin with a 10 min presentation of the use of firearms statistics in Skane PD, Sweden. The course will be following the Skane PD syllabus. In the end of the course there will be some drills, with blue guns that will put the system into realistic situations.

Title of Presentation: OFFENSIVE SHOOTING

Brief Overview of Presentation: This class will teach combat shooting in a pro-active Active Shooter Environment.

Topics will include point and aimed shooting combined with rapid movement towards the threat.

Title of Presentation: HEMORRHAGE CONTROL (QUIKCLOT) & SELF/BUDDY CARE

Presenter: Mark Robbins & Roy Landry **Agency:** CIR Associates

Brief Overview of Presentation:

To educate the frontline EMS providers and First Responders in the recognition and immediate control of “LIFE THREATENING” bleeding control.

Students in this course will learn the importance of early recognition and reasons for the control of severe life threatening hemorrhaging. The course will consist of classroom education, hands on practical application in a sterile environment. This course will focus on the use of QuikClot LE Combat Gauze, the Combat Action Tourniquet (CAT), the Special Operations Forces Tourniquet (SOF-TW) and the Stretch Wrap and Tuck Tourniquet (SWAT-T). We will talk about and give advice on how to bring this training to your individual officers. It is our desire to increase your officer’s survivability during a critical lethal force encounter.

OEMS Approval:

There is a total of 4 hrs continuing education credits issued by the Massachusetts Office of Emergency Medical Services (Mass OEMS), they can be broken down into 2 hrs of patient assessment and 1 hr of hemorrhage control and 1 hr of bandaging.

Brief Overview of Presentation: This will be an 8 hour MPTC recertification for firearms instructors in semi auto pistol, patrol rifle, shotgun and revolver.

Brief Overview of Presentation: To introduce the concept of “Longer Range Patrol Rifle”- beyond the standard 50 yard courses we normally train and qualify with. Participants will learn the equipment and officer requirements for this concept through discussion and live-fire courses. This presentation is an introduction to the Extended Range Patrol Rifle course developed by MLEFIAA.

What skills and knowledge will the students obtain in your class?

Equipment requirements for a “Designated Patrol Rifle”

Skill requirements for a “Designated Patrol Marksman”

Ability to engage a lethal threat within the 50-200 yard range not normally trained for by officers equipped with patrol rifles.

Required Equipment:

Patrol rifle with a low to medium power magnified optic, (minimum 3x preferred) which has been properly mounted, previously tested and zeroed. Due to time constraints we WILL NOT be able to take time to confirm your zero. Arrive prepared to shoot.

Title of Presentation: MPTC ADVANCED (Level II) FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR – (8 hours)

Brief Overview of Presentation: The Advanced Firearms Instructor (Level II) course is designed to teach basic firearms instructors how to teach recruits, auxiliary and reserve officers. The course will focus on the core fundamentals, helping and teaching the problem shooter

Course pre-requisites: Level II candidates shall -

- have a minimum of four (4) documented years of experience as a Level I firearms instructor;
- complete the MPTC Instructor Development Course or equivalent as approved by the MPTC;
- be sponsored by the agency head of a Massachusetts law enforcement agency, or in the case of guest instructors who are non-law enforcement, by a MPTC academy director or MPTC administrator;
- meet all firearms program specific requirements

Brief Overview of Presentation:

This course will provide the firearms instructor with ideas for the development and implementation of patrol rifle lesson plans.

What skills and knowledge will the students obtain in your class?

Ideas for conducting an alternate patrol rifle qualification with an induced stress level.

Reload drills.

Transition drills.

Movement to cover while reloading.

Different shooting platforms.

20 rounds to freedom.

Title of Presentation: THE SHOTGUN IN LAW ENFORCEMENT: PATROL & SPECIALIZED USE

Presenters: Lt. John S. Pajak

Agency: Mass. Environmental Police (ret.)

Brief Overview of Presentation: This course will examine the various uses of the shotgun beyond the “normal” applications of everyday patrol. Effective in close quarters battle and out to ranges beyond 50 yds., it is a comprehensive look at use of the shotgun as a versatile tool with multiple applications when placed in the hands of a properly trained operator. While the shotgun has fallen out of favor recently and is being supplanted with “patrol rifles” of various configurations, there is still a prominent place for it in any law enforcement agency’s arsenal.

What skills and knowledge will the students obtain in your class?

1. Shotgun types applicable to the law enforcement mission. (selection, fitting, carry/transport)
2. Mechanics of the shotgun and ballistic data/theory (choke, barrel configuration, sights, etc)
3. Ammunition types, selection, and applicability.
4. Support equipment and accessories.
5. Specialized weapons
6. Practical application(s) including loading, firing from multiple positions, close quarters battle techniques, transitioning to sidearm, eliminating stoppages.

7. Maintenance and preventative checks and services.

Title of Presentation: BRING BACK THE BASICS

Brief Overview of Presentation: The goal of the 4 hour block of instruction will be to provide the students / firearms instructors with simple pistol drills that build from the Basic Core Fundamentals (BCF) . Students / Instructors will be taken back to their BCF's and from there develop muscle memory where, when under stress, sighted fire may not be realistic to the situation. This course will prepare the Student / Instructors for the In-Service Firearms challenges that they encounter each time they go to the range.

What skills and knowledge will the students obtain in your class?

- Basic Core Fundamentals (BCF's)
- Diagnosing problem areas of the Student / Instructors
- Develop muscle memory
- Eliminate potential training scars
- Analyze the 2012 FBI Data and what it means to the Student / Instructor
- Building BCF into a Qualification Course of Fire under timed conditions.

Title of Presentation: LIGHTS, LASERS & SIGHTS WORKSHOP

Brief Overview of Presentation: In this intensive hands-on workshop, attendees will delve into basic through advanced techniques for Lights, Sights and Lasers and their application in today's modern combat weapons under demanding real-world conditions. Build mentality and firearm handling skills effectively and efficiently in actual engagement considering real world scenarios that unfold quickly, this program focuses on dynamic movement, reaction time enhancement, compressed distance and unconventional shooting positions. Through Khyber hands-on training and demanding drills, attendees will train on techniques far outside their current comfort zone, confronting them with new challenges, forcing them to solve problems rapidly and maximizing skills.

Title of presentation: FIREARMS TACTICS FOR K-9 HANDLERS

Brief overview of presentation: Law enforcement firearms instructors are responsible to provide legally defensible firearms programs for their agency. For many, this includes ensuring their agency's K9 Handlers are prepared to handle all standard patrol duties plus high risk activities including response to active shooter incidents, correctional facility escapes, and assistance to tactical teams executing searches warrants. The safety of K9 Handlers, their K9 partners, and other officers can be enhanced through understanding of tactics and strategies.

Equipment that the student must provide:

Suitable range attire

K9s are not necessary for this course.

Title of presentation: BASIC ROOM CLEARING

Brief overview of presentation:

This class will address interior combat and room clearing. Included will be proper mindset and understanding the dynamic environment. The material will be delivered by lecture and practical application exercises. The training will target 2-4 person entry tactics that apply to the patrol officer and tactical team. Students will gain knowledge in managing the tactical environment, interior movement, room entry tactics, and proper mindset.

fundamentals and manipulations prior to this course.

Title of Presentation: TEACHING TEAM TACTICS FOR PATROL OFFICERS

Brief Overview of Presentation: This course will focus on team tactics that can be employed by multiple officers (2 or more) responding to emergency, high-risk calls where the use of force is an increased possibility. We will focus on teaching communication, both verbal and non verbal, movement, team movement, contact and cover, cover fire, physical contact with the offender and the deployment and ideal usage of multiple weapon platforms. For this training segment we will only be focusing on handguns due to time allowances.

Title of presentation: SURVIVING THE AMBUSH

Brief overview of presentation:

This course will introduce the reality of combat shooting and the skillset that may help them to survive an ambush. This course will provide the instructor with a training platform to build confidence in his or hers students ability to draw, fire and strike a suspect in less than ideal shooting conditions as well as utilizing various cover to win the fight.

Students will gain knowledge on the proper mindset and key components needed to overcome and survive the ambush. Students will be exposed to the elements of combat shooting, stationary and movement shooting, as well as firing their weapons from various conventional and unconventional positions and fighting to their feet to regain a position of advantage.

Brief Overview of Presentation: This the MPTC standard program to qualify instructors with 12 ga. stabilized shotgun rounds and 40mm direct impact munitions (foam / sponge rounds). This is a direct fire, high energy munitions, single target, less lethal program

12 gauge shotgun – 10 beanbag (drag stabilized rounds)

40mm launcher – 10 foam / sponge rounds

Title of Presentation: LEOSA RETIRED OFFICER CERTIFICATION

Presenter: Todd Bailey

Agency: Kingston Police Dept. / MPTC Firearms Staff

Brief Overview of Presentation: This class will provide the required annual certification mandated by 18 USC 926C and 515 CMR 6.04 for retired officers who desire to carry concealed handguns nationwide.

Required equipment:

Pistol or Revolver you intend to carry*

Concealment holster

150 rounds ammo (ball ammo is OK)

Eye & hearing protection and hat w/ visor

VALID LICENSE TO CARRY & YOUR RETIRED DEPARTMENT ID CARD

*Note: If you wish to carry both types, the law requires you to “qualify” with both.

Most deadly force encounters using firearms occur within 7 feet and last only 3-seconds with an average of 3 shots fired. Be prepared to defend yourself in these close quarter situations.
