Title of Presentation: Offensive Shooting

Presenters: Matt Temkin **Agency:** NYC Courts (ret.)

Brief overview of presentation: Combat shooting in a proactive 'active shooter' environment. Students will be provided with aimed and point shooting training combined with rapid movement toward the threat.

Title of Presentation: TREATMENT OF GUNSHOT WOUNDS

Presenters: Frank Eldridge **Agency:** Newton PD

Brief overview of presentation: This presentation will introduce the firearms instructor to emergency care of gunshot wounds. Students will learn Self Aid, Buddy Aid, tourniquet skills and receive an introduction to Law Enforcement Advanced Casualty Care.

Required equipment: No special equipment is required for this class

Title of Presentation: CONCEALED CARRY - OFF SHIFT SURVIVAL

Presenter: Mark Belliveau

Agency: MPTC

Brief overview of presentation: This program covers the benefits and usage of off duty weapons for the law enforcement officer. The advantages and disadvantages of various available weapons will be covered as well as developing a policy & procedure for off duty weapons for your agency. Also covered will be issues related to off duty carry such as selection of holsters, clothing and methods of carry.

Required equipment: Rifle, Handgun, concealment belt holster, ankle holster (optional) spare reloading devices, magazine holders, range safety equipment.

Title of Presentation: ADVANCED COACHING & DIAGNOSTICS

Brief Overview of Presentation: Placing quick, threat-stopping hits on target is the core of all gun fighting skills. In order to accomplish this goal, firearms instructors must develop practical, fundamental skills in new officers and improve the skills of veteran officers. Once these skills are developed, instructors must challenge all officers to identify their individual skill levels in order to balance combat speed and accuracy. This class will provide the law enforcement firearms instructor with concepts, information and teaching strategies that are critical for coaching combat handgun marksmanship at all skill levels.

Title of Presentation: FIREARMS TACTICS UPDATE for 2018

Presenter: Wade Johnson

Agency: Vermont Department of Corrections

Brief Overview of Presentation This class is based on real-world incidents that Law Enforcement officers have faced in the past year. Including ambush attacks on law enforcement, attacks on public venues by vehicle, and responding to armed barricaded subject incidents. Drills which can be incorporated into firearms training: 1) bail out drills from a cruiser, and vehicle take-downs(with non-firing blue guns only: 2) techniques to safely engage an imminent threat from a seated position; 3) defensive tactics when armed with a long gun, including moving through a crowd during an active shooter event; 4) incorporating movement; 5) less-lethal deployment teams and transitioning to other force options.

Required Equipment:

Suitable range attire, Personal Protective Equipment (eyes, ears, hat w/visor, body armor,), duty belt with handgun, and long gun, shotgun, is preferred if available.

50 rounds of shotgun

Title of Presentation: PISTOL SKILLS FOE THE PATROL

Presenter: Jerry Eramo

Agency: Rockland Police Dept.

Brief overview of presentation: Since the onset of officer worn body cameras, more and more video content is exposing the realities of gunfights. Fast presentation of the firearm, shooting onehanded and rapidly moving for cover all can be viewed today in most gun battles. Shooting and moving for cover, helping an injured person or holding something officers may be forced to utilize one handed skills to confront a suspect to protect their life or someone else.

Required equipment: Eye & hearing protection Body armor, Hat w/ visor, Duty Belt.
300 rounds of ammo

Title of Presentation: Precision Speed & Target Acquisition

Presenters: Daniel O'Toole & Terrance Leonard Agency: MBTA Transit Police

Brief overview of presentation: Students will be put through a series of drills to help them acquire targets faster and get better hits.

Required equipment: Pistol and 3 magazines with suitable holster and magazine pouch / carrier. Ear and eye protection. 250 rounds of pistol ammo.

Title of Presentation: Contact Pistol Tactics

Presenter: Steven Hayden Agency: NYPD/ESU (RET)

Brief overview of Presentation: Contact distance tactical responses to deadly threats, 10 feet into contact. Force options for proper response, empty hand, weapon and empty weapon techniques.

Required Equipment: Handgun, duty belt with 5 Magazines, eye, ear protection, hat with visor, knee and elbow pads and appropriate range attire.

Title of Presentation: Proper Zeroing of a Patrol Rifle

Presenter: Alan Rice Agency: Shirley PD

Brief overview of Presentation: The proper zeroing and understanding the trajectory of a patrol rifle to easily engage of targets at unknown distances from point of contact out to 100 yards.

Required Equipment: Patrol rifle or Carbine ideally equipped with a free float rail and a 2 point sling, 3 magazines, a sandbag or shooting mat, eye and ear protection, baseball type hat, knee and elbow pads optional.

300 rounds of rifle Ammo

Title of Presentation: CQB Patrol Rifle

Presenters: Carmine Vivolo Agency: Somerville P.D.

Brief overview of presentation: Basic rifle drills for departments who are implementing the patrol rifle. Initial certification requirements for officers. Tactical drills when deploying the patrol rifle. Students will learn basic knowledge of the patrol rifle. Tactical drills to bring back to their department and keep their students motivated.

Title of Presentation: ROC Patrol Rifle Overview

Presenter: Jay Borges

Agency: Somerset PD

Brief overview of presentation: Students will learn and understand the concepts behind the newly adapted MPTC recruit patrol rifle curriculum.

Required Equipment: Proper range attire, personal protection equipment (eye, ear, baseball type hat, vest), Duty Belt with Handgun, Rifle.

200 rounds of rifle ammo
50 rounds of handgun ammo

Title of Presentation: Combat Shotgun

Presenter: John S. Pajak

Agency: Brimfield PD /Mass Environmental Police (RET)

Brief overview of the presentation: This course will examine the various uses of the shotgun beyond the “normal” applications of everyday patrol. Effective in close quarters battle and out to ranges beyond 50 yards. It is a comprehensive look at use of shotgun as a versatile tool with multiple applications when placed in the hands of a properly trained operator.

Required Equipment: Law Enforcement type shotgun, pump or autoloader. Duty belt w/ Handgun, proper range attire, personal safety equipment (eye, ear, vest, and baseball type hat).

25 rounds of slugs, 25 rounds buckshot (00 or #4), 50 rounds birdshot #8 or 9 low brass 100 rounds of handgun.

Title of Presentation: LEOSA Recertification for Retired Officers

Presenter: Todd Bailey

Agency: Kingston P.D. / Bourne Dept. of Natural Resources

Brief overview of the presentation: This program meets the state and federal requirements for retired officer certification to carry a concealed firearm nationwide. The retiree will receive reading material via email prior to the range date which satisfies the 4 hour course requirement. Retirees may qualify with pistol and/or revolver. Please contact Todd Bailey at tabailey@mlefiaa.org if you are signing up for this program to receive the handout material. Course fee: \$85.00

Required Equipment: A pistol or revolver with a concealment holster made for that firearm. Spare magazines or speedloaders will make the program run smoother. Retiree should bring their personal safety equipment (ball cap, eye and hearing protection).

Ammo Requirement: The course of fire is 50 rounds. If you intend to shoot both pistol & revolver, bring ammo for both. It is recommended that the retiree bring at least 100 rounds for each handgun.
